

## 12 Things You Can Do With Your AMA Membership

1. Negotiate employment and managed care contracts. The AMA offers you a wealth of contract guides including *Contracts: What You Need to Know*, *The Model Managed Care Contract*, and the *Model Physician Employment Agreement*
2. Understand the USMLE process, the board certification process, and the basics of getting a license.
3. Know the basics of getting professional liability insurance and how to find part-time coverage for a part-time practice.
4. Know what to consider when exploring new practice opportunities. The free guide *Making the Right Choice: Assessing Practice Opportunities* includes information on geographic location resources, compensation issues, and online job banks.
5. Learn practical advice on preparing a CV and useful tips to help you with your job search.
6. Receive a free Physician Recognition Award certificate in your third year of residency. This PRA is accepted by many state licensing boards, hospitals and other professional medical organizations as evidence of your completion of CME requirements. 25 states accept the PRA certificate in lieu of CME requirements for your license registration.
7. Send your Physician Profiles free to licensure boards. The service is free to you as an AMA member, a \$26 cost per inquiry for non-members. You can also request a free Self Inquiry Profile to verify your credentials.
8. Know how to document and code claims correctly with six free CPT coding inquiries (\$360 value).
9. Download free worksheets, sample office letters, and chapter excerpts from AMA Press Practice Management books.
10. Earn free CME credit from *JAMA* and *Archives* journals. Earn category 1 CME credit by reading peer-reviewed, clinically relevant articles and completing a brief online quiz highlighting the article's important points. (AMA members have unlimited free online access to all nine *Archives* specialty journals and *JAMA*.)
