

Aspirin at Arrival for Acute Myocardial Infarction (AMI)

Coding Specifications

Codes required to document patient has an emergency department discharge diagnosis of acute myocardial infarction and an emergency department visit occurred:

An ICD-9 diagnosis code for acute myocardial infarction and a CPT E/M service code and a place of service indicator for emergency department are required to identify patients to be included in this measure.

Acute myocardial infarction ICD-9 diagnosis codes

- 410.01, 410.11, 410.21, 410.31, 410.41, 410.51, 410.61, 410.71, 410.81, 410.91 (Acute myocardial infarction)

AND

CPT E/M service codes

- 99281, 99282, 99283, 99284, 99285 (emergency department visit),
- 99291 (critical care)

AND

- Place of Service Indicator: 23 (emergency department)

Quality codes for this measure (one of the following for every eligible patient):

CPT II Code descriptors

(Data Collection sheet should be used to determine appropriate combination of codes.)

- **CPT II 4084F:** Aspirin received within 24 hours before emergency department arrival or during emergency department stay
- **CPT II 4084F-1P:** Documentation of medical reason(s) for not receiving or taking aspirin within 24 hours before emergency department arrival or during emergency department stay
- **CPT II 4084F-2P:** Documentation of patient reason(s) for not receiving or taking aspirin within 24 hours before emergency department arrival or during emergency department stay
- **CPT II 4084F-8P:** Aspirin was not received within 24 hours before emergency department arrival or during emergency department stay, reason not otherwise specified

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
