

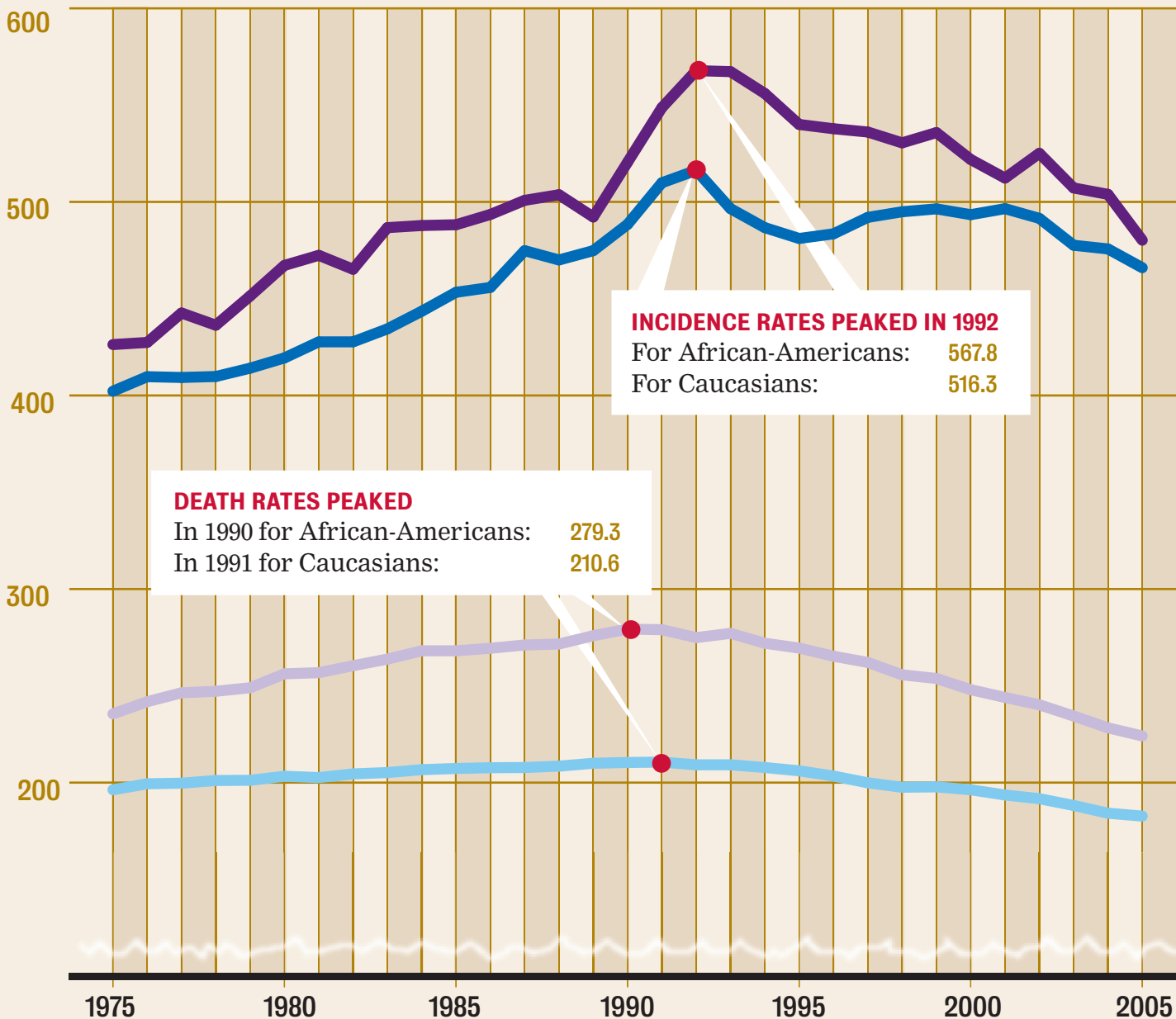
DISPARITIES IN CANCER MORTALITY

African-Americans are more likely than Caucasians to die of cancer. Research suggests that a large part of this difference may be due to disparities in incidence rates. Here is how the death rate and incidence rate per 100,000 changed over three decades.
