An Act

To provide for periodic payments of awards for future damages

| 1 | Be it enacted by the People of the State of, represented in the General |
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| 2 | Assembly: |
| 3 | Section 1. Definitions. As used in this Act: |
| 4 | (a) "Future damages" includes damages for future medical treatment, care or custody, |
| 5 | loss of future earnings, loss of bodily function or future pain and suffering of the |
| 6 | judgment creditor. |
| 7 | (b) "Health care provider" [*] means any doctor of medicine, doctor of osteopathy or |
| 8 | hospital licensed by this State to provide health care services and an officer, |
| 9 | employee or agent of such provider acting in the course and scope of employment. |
| 10 | (c) "Health care services" means acts of diagnosis, treatment, medical evaluation or |
| 11 | advice or such other acts as may be permissible under the health care licensing |
| 12 | statutes of this State. |
| 13 | (d) "Judgment creditor" means a person who has obtained a judgment against a health |
| 14 | care provider for injury or death, arising out of the provision of or failure to provide |
| 15 | health care services. |
| 16 | (e) "Judgment debtor" means a health care provider against whom a judgment has been |
| 17 | recovered or any successors in interest of such person, where the judgment is |
| 18 | unsatisfied. |

* May designate other health professionals licensed by the State.

| 1 | (f) "Periodic payments" means the payment of money or delivery of other property to |
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| 2 | the judgment creditor at regular intervals. |
| 3 | Section 2. Periodic Payments of Future Damages. |
| 4 | (a) In any action for damages for injury or death against any health care provider, |
| 5 | whether based on tort, breach of contract or otherwise, arising out of the provision of |
| 6 | or failure to provide health care services, the court in which such action is brought |
| 7 | shall enter a judgment ordering future damages of the judgment creditor to be paid in |
| 8 | whole or in part by periodic payments rather than by a lump-sum payment if the |
| 9 | award equals or exceeds one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) in future damages. |
| 10 | In entering a judgment ordering the payment of future damages by periodic |
| 11 | payments, the court shall make a specific finding as to the dollar amount of periodic |
| 12 | payments which will compensate the judgment creditor for such future damages. As |
| 13 | a condition to authorizing periodic payments of future damages, the court shall |
| 14 | require that such payments be made through the establishment of a trust fund or the |
| 15 | purchase of an annuity for the life of such judgment creditor or during the |
| 16 | continuance of the compensable injury or disability of the judgment creditor. |
| 17 | (b) The judgment ordering the payment of future damages by periodic payments shall |
| 18 | specify the recipient or recipients of the payments, the dollar amount of the |
| 19 | payments, the interval between payments, and the number of payments or the period |
| 20 | of time over which payments shall be made. Such payments shall only be subject to |
| 21 | modification by the court in the event of the death of the judgment creditor, as |
| 22 | provided in Section 3, or upon petition to the court, as provided in Section 4. |

Section 3. Effect of Death. In any judgment where future damages are payable in
periodic payments, liability for payment of future damages not yet due shall terminate upon the
death of the judgment creditor. Provided, however, that the court which rendered the original
judgment may modify the judgment to provide that damages awarded for loss of future earnings
shall not be reduced or payments terminated by reason of the death of the judgment creditor, but
shall be paid to persons whom the judgment creditor owed a duty of support, as provided by law,
immediately prior to the judgment creditor's death.

8 Section 4. Satisfaction of Judgment. Following the occurrence or expiration of all 9 obligations specified in the periodic payment judgment, any obligation of the judgment debtor to 10 make further payments shall cease. Provided, however, that if the judgment creditor lives beyond 11 the date of the final payment by the judgment debtor, the judgment creditor may apply to the court for additional payments for economic damages resulting from the injury arising out of the 12 13 provision of or failure to provide health care services that was the subject of the initial cause of 14 action. Such additional payments shall be calculated at the annual rate at which damages were 15 calculated under the initial order for payment of future damages.

16 Section 5. Penalties. In the event that the court finds that the judgment debtor has 17 exhibited a continuing pattern of failing to make the payments specified in Section 2, the court 18 shall find the judgment debtor in contempt of court and, in addition to the required periodic 19 payments, shall order the judgment debtor to pay the judgment creditor all damages caused by the

20 failure to make such periodic payments, including court costs and attorney's fees.
