<b>Report F: AMA-YPS Internal Operating Procedures</b>	<p><b>Adopted</b></p> <p>Pursuant to the adoption of Report D-I-12 (AMA-YPS Internal Operating Procedures), the Ad Hoc Committee on Internal Operating Procedures worked in conjunction with your Governing Council and the Council on Constitution and Bylaws (CCB) to present the YPS IOP to the AMA Board of Trustees (BOT) for their approval. The CCB has reviewed the updated IOP to ensure that it is not in conflict with AMA Bylaws, is internally consistent, and is consistent with the IOPs of the other AMA sections. The AMA-YPS IOP was approved by the BOT at their April 2013 meeting.</p> <p>The AMA-YPS IOP contains language to comport with bylaw changes, including a new apportionment formula adopted by the HOD in 2007. Other editorial changes have been made for clarity. These changes are outlined in AMA-YPS Report F.</p> <p>Your Governing Council proposes that the AMA-YPS Assembly adopt the following recommendation and file the balance of this report:</p> <p>1. That the AMA-YPS Assembly ratify the <u>2013 YPS Internal Operating Procedures</u>.</p>	To be implemented
