In this document...

- An asterisk (*) in a response category means that less than 0.5% of respondents chose that response category and a dash (-) represents no response.
- "Skip base" is the percentage of voters that are asked a question because they meet a criteria based on a response to a previous question, meaning not all 600 voters received that question.
- "Total base" is the percentage of the total sample, in this survey that is 600 voters.
