How are councils and sections similar/different?

Key role	Report to the HOD and BOT on relevant issues	Communication, outreach, education, networking, advocacy
Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Hold meetings at Annual, Interim- Hold educational sessions at Annual, Interim- Respond to requests for comment from external organizations; collate comments from AMA sections and other interested groups- Convene internal and external stakeholders for discussion and action on relevant issues	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Hold meetings at Annual, Interim- Hold educational sessions at Annual, Interim- Offer webinars, conference calls, summits, and other means for member engagement- Publish white papers or HOD informational reports on activities- Review HOD reports and resolutions of relevance, to help direct voting by delegate(s)
Products	HOD reports, as referred by BOT (or self-initiated).	HOD resolutions
Members	Elected by the HOD (although some are appointed)	Self-select to participate in the section; a section's Governing Council is elected by members
Members	Generally from the HOD.	Must be AMA members but not HOD delegates.



AMA caucuses

- In simplest terms, a caucus is a meeting.
- Within the HOD, or within a given section, different states or groups may come together to caucus.
- Delegates may participate in multiple caucuses (specialty, state, and region)
- Delegates try to reach consensus on HOD items of business and/or reference committee report recommendations.
- Caucuses also provide a venue for networking and leadership development.




One example: The Academic Medicine Caucus

- Started at A-12, through leadership by the AMA-SMS
- Provides an opportunity for networking among AMA delegates who serve as medical school faculty and cannot attend the SMS meeting (which ends prior to HOD opening on Saturday).
- Attendees discuss issues of mutual concern and interest pertaining to academic medicine.
- Generally held on Monday morning of HOD, from 9:30 to 11 a.m.




How it all fits together: the AMA policy-making process
