Dear AMA Resident & Fellow Section:

It is with great excitement that I write this letter of nomination for Dr. Hans Arora for the resident/fellow seat on the American Medical Association Board of Trustees. Dr. Arora is an exemplary member of our delegation, and has demonstrated superior leadership, thoughtfulness, and commitment to the profession that is on par with some of the most senior physicians.

I first had the pleasure of meeting Dr. Arora when he was a medical student of the AMA at the 2012 Interim Meeting in Honolulu. At the time, he already had demonstrated a strong commitment to organized medicine, having served as national Chair of the AMA Medical Student Section, overseeing the activities of its 40,000-plus members nationwide. He also has served as the sole student member of the AMA Council on Medical Education. Having already decided to pursue urology, the soon-to-be-Dr. Arora was looking to apply his ongoing experience with the AMA to urology-specific issues.

Even as a first-year resident, Dr. Arora was selected to serve on the AUA Residents Committee as its AMA representative. In his first meeting as a resident, Hans was elected as one of 20 residents from across the country to serve as an RFS sectional delegate to the AMA House of Delegates, representing not just his resident colleagues but practicing urologists nationwide to the principal policy-making body of the AMA. To this day, he continues to be a steadfast member of our AUA delegation. He has remained active and vocal on a variety of issues important to our profession such as increasing awareness and legislation on recognition and treatment of genitourinary battlefield injuries, protecting the in-office ancillary services exception to the Stark Law, and expanding insurance coverage for penile prosthetics for erectile dysfunction. In addition, his advocacy efforts have extended to policy issues relevant to all physicians, including the repeal of the Sustainable Growth Rate formula, implementation of ICD-10, and he even personally led the Resident and Fellow Section of the AMA in writing and introducing a resolution to make developing a sustainable funding mechanism for Graduate Medical Education a top legislative priority for the AMA, testifying in front of the entire House of Delegates on the importance of maintaining a strong pipeline of future physicians.

The ease with which Dr. Arora is able to navigate the complex policy-making processes of the House of Delegates was no better exemplified than at the 2015 Interim meeting, where he alerted our delegation that only a few days prior the

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Centers for Medicare & Medical Services proposed update to its clinical quality measure on PSA testing, which was developed by a third party based largely upon the very flawed USPSTF guidelines, without the input of key stakeholder groups within urology including the AUA. Dr. Arora immediately stepped up to take a lead and he was instrumental in successfully canvassing support from his wide network for an emergency resolution which he also helped draft that required the AMA to formally demand that quality measures for PSA testing involve expert urological input, and ensuring protection of access to men who would benefit from prostate cancer screening.

Dr. Arora has been and continues to be one of the most active and involved resident members we have had since my time with the AUA. Not only has he earned the respect of our fellow delegates, but also has clearly demonstrated himself as a leader among his resident peers, having been elected as national Chair for the AMA Resident & Fellow Section in 2016-2017. What is less known by this body is that he concomitantly served as Chair of the AUA Residents and Fellows Committee at the same time, overseeing an AUA Section-elected international body of residents and fellows, coordinating all resident activities of our Annual Meeting and serving as the voice of trainees on the Section Secretaries Membership Committee (the American Urological Association's governing membership council).

His outstanding contributions to our delegation and urology at-large led him to being selected as the 2016-2017 AUA H. Logan Holtgrewe Legislative Fellow. In so doing not only did he serve as a member of our Public Policy Council and Legislative Affairs Committee, but through his own interest and initiative was appointed a member of the Telemedicine Workgroup. Most unique during his time as our fellow, Dr. Arora worked in Washington, DC in the office of former Congressman Patrick J. Tiberi (OH-12), researching potential policy topics, preparing issue-specific memoranda, attending Congressional hearings, and briefing the Congressman on current topics in healthcare. From his experience, Dr. Arora received glowing praise by a seated member of Congress for his service. He continues to engage in policy-related activities in Washington, DC as a member of the Planning Committee of the Annual Urology Advocacy Summit, and has been an invited speaker on current regulatory and legislative issues at the AUA's North Central Section meeting earlier this year.

His advocacy efforts in Washington, DC have also included multiple trips to Capitol Hill lobbying on behalf of patients and physicians as part of the AMA National Advocacy Conference, the Urology Joint Advocacy Conference, and the aforementioned Annual Urology Advocacy Summit. At the same time, he understands the balance between national and local politics, having volunteered with the Rahm Emanuel mayoral campaign in Chicago. His interests in advocacy extends to the academic setting, where he is an invited reviewer for the *Urology Practice* journal, focused on legislative, socioeconomic, and educational issues relevant to the practice of urology.

In conclusion, it is with great pleasure that I nominate Dr. Hans Arora for the position of resident member of the American Medical Association Board of Trustees. It has been an absolute pleasure to work with him over the past few years. He has been a great asset to

our urology delegation to the AMA, and continues to be invested in legislative and advocacy priorities locally and nationally with our American Urological Association. I am confident that his commitment to furthering policy and legislative issues important to medicine will advance the value and significance of this prestigious opportunity, and I am certain that his service on the Board will continue accelerating his ongoing trajectory of leadership and service to our profession.




