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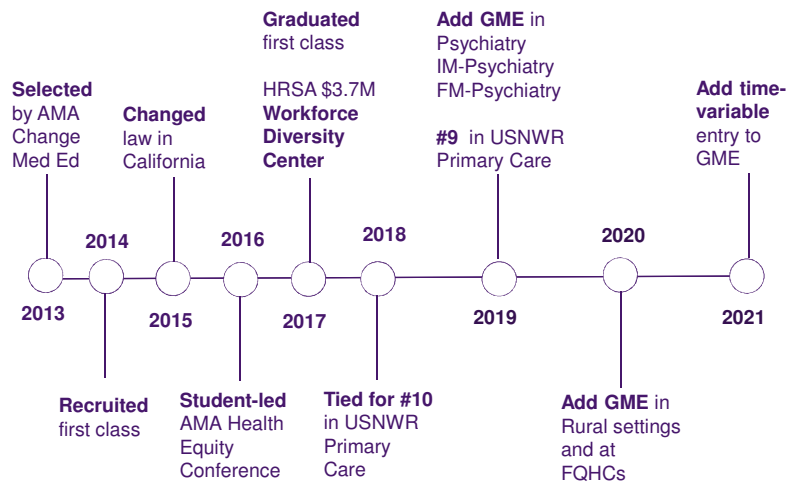

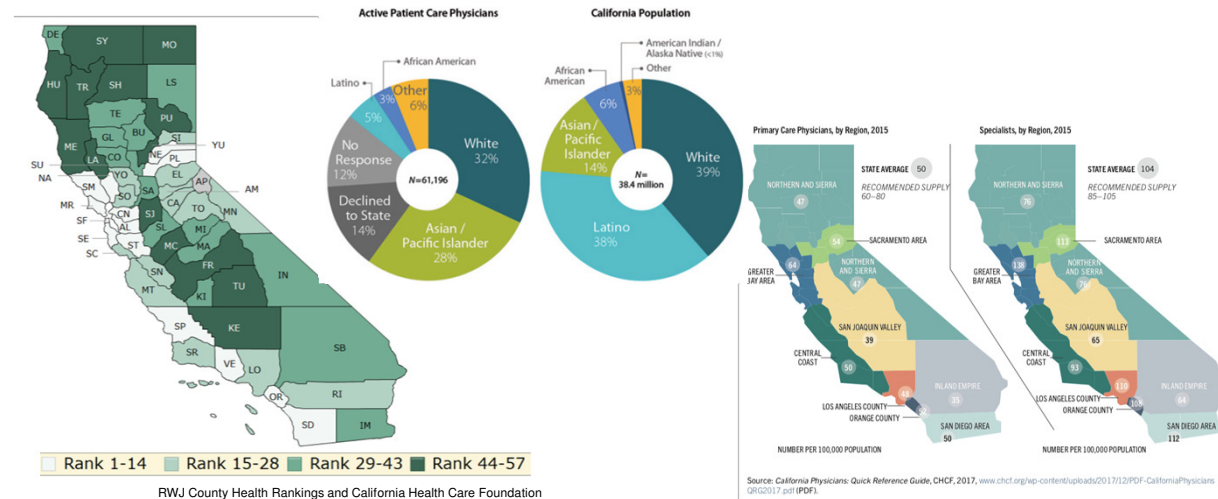
Making ACE-PC 2.0

Addressing Needs in Low Resource Communities
