

As a current internal medicine resident serving a largely underserved community, I have seen how poor access to health resources directly affect health outcomes. In college, I worked within the Peruvian Ministry of Health to change their malaria treatment policies. In medical school I co-founded the state lobby day, annually leading students to meet with legislators to advocate for education and healthcare. In residency, I was a health policy fellow for a US Presidential Campaign and was elected National Delegate to the 2016 Democratic National Convention. This year, I was appointed by the Iowa Supreme Court to the Iowa Access to Justice Commission.
