



Call for Candidates for AMA Nomination for the ACGME Review Committee for Nuclear Medicine

The AMA is soliciting AMA member candidates for nomination by the AMA Board of Trustees for the **Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education Review Committee for Nuclear Medicine (ACGME RC-NUCMED)**.

TERM

The term of the position is 6 years, from July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2031.

TIME REQUIREMENT

Nominees must be able to devote sufficient time to the Review Committee's work. The Review Committee for Nuclear Medicine meets two times per year, usually in January and April. The duration of the meetings is one to two days. At times, the Committee may meet via conference call depending on the meeting agenda. Review Committee Members must attend all Review Committee meetings.

The nominee must have sufficient time to review program information (an estimated 10-15 hours for program review assignments for each meeting), to participate in subcommittee work (as assigned), prepare for each Review Committee meeting by reviewing agenda items and related documents, travel/ attendance to each Review Committee meeting, and participate in other activities of the Review Committee.

Anticipated meeting dates for the new member are as follows:

Review Committee meeting to observe – January 24, 2025

Review Committee meeting to observe – April 16, 2025

Two Review Committee meetings per year – January 2026 (dates TBD); April 2026 (dates TBD)

CRITERIA FOR AMA NOMINATION TO ACGME RC-NUCMED

ACGME RC-NUCMED Requirements for this Opportunity

1. Nominees must be currently certified by the American Board of Nuclear Medicine in nuclear medicine.

2. Nominees must have at least 3 years' experience as a program director or faculty member of an ACGME-accredited Nuclear Medicine residency program.
3. Nominees' programs must be in good standing with ACGME and have a status of Continued Accreditation.
4. Nominees must not be a program director of any other residency program.
5. Nominees must participate in major specialty societies and have a current association with Graduate Medical Education.
6. The Review Committee can have up to two members from the same state, but such members cannot be from the same institution or city/metropolitan area. Accordingly, individuals must not be nominated from the following institutions and areas:
 - Yale University, Connecticut
 - University of Miami, Florida
 - Emory University, Georgia
 - University of Iowa, Iowa
 - Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri
 - University of Washington, Washington
7. Review Committee members must use electronic systems for reimbursement of expenses, accreditation activities, and accessing meeting materials; therefore, nominees must have knowledge and facility in the use of computers and applications.
8. Nominees must be able to devote sufficient time to the Review Committee's work. The Review Committee for Nuclear Medicine meets two times per year, usually in January and April. The duration of the meetings is one to two days. At times, the Committee may meet via conference call depending on the meeting agenda. Review Committee Members must attend all Review Committee meetings.
9. The nominee must have sufficient time to review program information (an estimated 10-15 hours for program review assignments for each meeting), to participate in subcommittee work (as assigned), prepare for each Review Committee meeting by reviewing agenda items and related documents, travel/ attendance to each Review Committee meeting, and participate in other activities of the Review Committee.
10. Nominees must NOT be an active member of any ABMS recognized specialty Board, except ABNM.
11. Nominees must NOT be an officer or serve as a committee chair for any organization other than the SNMMI, ACNM, or ABNM.
12. Additional characteristics that are desired, but not required:
 - Program director experience within the past 5 years
 - Documentation of leadership in the Nuclear Medicine Community
 - Geographic location: Midwest, Southwestern United States

AMA Requirements

Each nominee recommended by the AMA must be a member of the AMA at the time of nomination. If appointed, he/she must maintain AMA member status throughout the term of appointment. AMA membership does not guarantee a position. Non-members may activate their

1. Completed electronic **Application for AMA Nomination for External Leadership Position – ACGME RC-NUCMED** (MS Word document preferred). This document is included on the AMA [Medical Education Leadership Opportunities](#) Web page.
2. Current **abbreviated curriculum vitae** [not to exceed three (3) pages].
3. Current **full curriculum vitae**.
4. *Optional*: Up to two letters of recommendation, addressed to the AMA.

Note: If nominated, letters of recommendation may be included as part of the nominee materials sent to the requesting organization.
