



Call for Candidates for AMA Nomination for the ACGME Review Committee for Family Medicine

The AMA is soliciting AMA member candidates for nomination by the AMA Board of Trustees for the **Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education Review Committee for Family Medicine (ACGME RC-FM)**.

TERM

The term of the position is 6 years, from July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2032.

TIME REQUIREMENT

Nominees must be able to devote enough time to the Committee's work. The Committee meets three times a year. The duration of meetings is typically 2 days. Appointed members must attend all Committee meetings.

Nominees will need enough time to fulfill the responsibilities to the Committee. This will include participation in 1) new program reviews and other non-accreditation reviews; 2) annual data review for all accredited programs; 3) subcommittee work (as assigned); 4) prep time for each Committee meeting to review agenda items (and related documents); and 5) actual travel/attendance to each meeting.

Future meeting dates have not been determined beyond 2026; however, it is expected that the Review Committee will meet three times a year; January, April and October (observation meeting to occur in April 2026). Actual dates will be communicated in a formal welcome letter to the appointee.

CRITERIA FOR AMA NOMINATION TO ACGME RC-FM

ACGME RC-FM Requirements for this Opportunity

1. Nominees must be a board-certified family medicine physician with a background in education and expertise in graduate medical education.

2. Although the Committee may have up to two members from the same state, nominees should not be from the same city/metropolitan area. Accordingly, individuals should not be nominated by institutions of the current Committee roster as follows:
 - Ventura County Medical Center Family Medicine
 - Saint Alphonsus Medical Group, Idaho
 - Roy J. and Lucille A. Carver College of Medicine, Iowa
 - UMass Memorial Health, Massachusetts
 - Ascension Genesys, Michigan
 - University of Nevada, Nevada
 - Drexel University, Pennsylvania
 - Kaiser Permanente, Washington
 - Mayo Clinic Health, Wisconsin
3. Nominees must be skilled in the use of computers. Committee members must use electronic systems for reimbursement of expenses and many accreditation activities, including program reviews.
4. Nominees must be able to devote enough time to the Committee's work. The Committee meets three times a year. The duration of meetings is typically 2 days. Appointed members must attend all Committee meetings.
5. Nominees will need enough time to fulfill the responsibilities to the Committee. This will include participation in 1) new program reviews and other non-accreditation reviews; 2) annual data review for all accredited programs; 3) subcommittee work (as assigned); 4) prep time for each Committee meeting to review agenda items (and related documents); and 5) actual travel/attendance to each meeting.
6. It is desired that nominees have experience as a program director for a core family medicine residency program or family medicine fellowship or served as the DIO for an institution offering accredited GME programs, and not out of the role for more than three (3) years.
7. Nominees must participate in major specialty societies or have a current or past association with graduate medical education.
8. Nominees' programs must have a status of Continued Accreditation.
9. Additional characteristics that are desired:
 - Ability to express views clearly and concisely
 - Demonstrate ability to work collaboratively
 - Fairness

AMA Requirements

Each nominee recommended by the AMA must be a member of the AMA at the time of nomination. If appointed, he/she must maintain AMA member status throughout the term of appointment. To apply for nomination, complete and email the following documents to mary.grandau@ama-assn.org by **Monday, December 15, 2025**:

1. Completed electronic **Application for AMA Nomination for External Leadership Position – ACGME RC-FM** (MS Word document preferred). This document is included on the AMA [Medical Education Leadership Opportunities](#) Web page.
2. Current **abbreviated curriculum vitae** [not to exceed three (3) pages].
3. Current **full curriculum vitae**.
4. *Optional*: One letter of recommendation addressed to the AMA. No more than one letter of recommendation will be accepted. Note that, if nominated, the letter of recommendation may be included as part of the nominee materials sent to the requesting organization.
