

**POLICY PROCEEDINGS OF THE NOVEMBER 2020 MEETING OF THE
AMA ORGANIZED MEDICAL STAFF SECTION**

RESOLUTIONS

**1. Discharge Summary Reform
Introduced by Doug Morrell, MD**

OMSS Action: Resolution 1 adopted as amended:

RESOLVED, That our American Medical Association coordinate with the American Hospital Association with input from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services and other professional organizations as appropriate to revive the concise discharge summary that existed prior to electronic medical records for the sake of much improved patient care and safety (Directive to Take Action); and be it further

RESOLVED, That our OMSS Governing Council internally develop a model hospital discharge summary in such a manner as to be concise but informational, include to promote excellent, safe patient care and improve coordinated discharge planning. This model use shall be promoted to our American Medical Association and Federation of Medicine colleagues (Directive to Take Action).

HOD Action: Resolution 1 will be forwarded to the AMA House of Delegates for consideration at a future meeting.

**2. Protecting Healthcare Professionals in Society
Introduced by Matthew Gold, MD**

OMSS Action: Resolution 2 adopted as amended and transmitted to the AMA House of Delegates for consideration at the 2020 Special Meeting:

RESOLVED, That our American Medical Association acknowledge and act to reduce the incidence of antagonistic actions against health care professionals outside as well as within the workplace, including physical violence, intimidating actions of word or deed, and cyber-attacks, particularly those which appear motivated simply by their identification as a health care professional (Directive to Take Action); and be it further

RESOLVED, That our American Medical Association educate the general public on the prevalence of violence and personal harassment against health care professionals, outside as well as within the workplace (Directive to Take Action); and be it further

RESOLVED, That our American Medical Association work with all interested stakeholders to improve safety of health care workers including first responders and public health officials and prevent violence to health care professionals (Directive to Take Action).

HOD Action: Resolution 413 be adopted as amended with change in title:

PROTECTING HEALTHCARE WORKERS IN SOCIETY

RESOLVED, That our American Medical Association acknowledge and act to reduce the incidence of antagonistic actions against health care workers including first responders and public health officials, outside as well as within the workplace, including physical violence, intimidating actions of word or deed, and

cyber-attacks, particularly those which appear motivated simply by their identification as a health care professional (Directive to Take Action); and be it further

RESOLVED, That our AMA educate the general public on the prevalence of violence and personal harassment against health care workers including first responders and public health officials, outside as well as within the workplace (Directive to Take Action).

3. Availability of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) **Introduced by David Welsh, MD**

OMSS Action: Resolution 3 adopted as amended and transmitted to the AMA House of Delegates for consideration at the 2020 Special Meeting:

RESOLVED, That our American Medical Association actively supports that physicians and healthcare professionals are empowered to use workplace modifications to continue professional patient care when they determine such action to be appropriate and in the best interest of patient and physician wellbeing. Physicians and healthcare professionals must be permitted to use their professional judgement and augment institution-provided PPE with additional, appropriately decontaminated, personally-provided PPE without penalty (Directive to Take Action); and be it further

RESOLVED, That our American Medical Association affirms that the medical staff of each healthcare institution should be integrally involved in disaster planning, strategy and tactical management of ongoing crises (Directive to Take Action); and be it further

RESOLVED, That our American Medical Association support a physician's right to participate in public commentary addressing the adequacy of clinical resources and/or health and environmental safety conditions necessary to provide appropriate and safe care of patients and physicians during a pandemic or natural disaster (Directive to Take Action).

HOD Action: Alternate Resolution 412 adopted in lieu of Resolution 412:

RESOLVED, That our American Medical Association affirm that the medical staff of each health care institution should be integrally involved in disaster planning, strategy and tactical management of ongoing crises (New HOD Policy); and be it further

RESOLVED, That our AMA support evidence-based standards and national guidelines for PPE use, reuse, and appropriate cleaning/decontamination during surge conditions (New HOD Policy); and be it further

RESOLVED, That our AMA advocate that it is the responsibility of health care facilities to provide sufficient personal protective equipment (PPE) for all employees and staff in the event of a pandemic, natural disaster, or other surge in patient volume or PPE need (Directive to Take Action); and be it further

RESOLVED, That our AMA support physicians and health care professionals in being permitted to use their professional judgement and augment institution-provided PPE with additional, appropriately decontaminated, personally-provided person protective equipment (PPE) without penalty (Directive to Take Action); and be it further

RESOLVED, That our AMA support a physician's right to participate in public commentary addressing the adequacy of clinical resources and/or health and environmental safety conditions necessary to provide appropriate and safe care of patients and physicians during a pandemic or natural disaster (Directive to Take Action); and be it further

RESOLVED, That our AMA work with the HHS Office of the Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response to gain an understanding of the PPE supply chain and ensure the adequacy of the Strategic National Stockpile for public health emergencies. (Directive to Take Action)

**4. Crisis Payment Reform Advocacy
Introduced by the OMSS Governing Council**

OMSS Action: Resolution 4 adopted as amended and transmitted to the AMA House of Delegates for consideration at the 2020 Special Meeting:

RESOLVED, That our American Medical Association promote awareness of the loss of physician medical practices due to COVID-19 that will disrupt healthcare availability to many patients (Directive to Take Action); and be it further

RESOLVED, That our AMA: (1) promote reform in our healthcare payment system that supports and sustains physician medical practices not only under routine circumstances but also in an extended crisis situation such as COVID-19; (2) advocate for, as a priority directive, a blueprint for action along those lines to the newly installed Presidential administration and Congress in early 2021 and beyond; and (3) monitor and aim to improve, along with other stakeholders, any new healthcare initiative(s) in a contemporaneously effective manner. (Directive to Take Action)

HOD Action: Alternate 218 adopted as amended by addition and deletion:

RESOLVED, That our American Medical Association continue to promote national awareness of the loss of physician medical practices and patient access to care due to COVID-19, and continue to advocate for reforms that support and sustain physician medical practices. (Directive to Take Action)
