Statement of Interest: While a significant portion of my leadership experience

has been through SNMA and National Medical Association, ultimately as National President of both, I see the opportunity to serve on the AMA Governing Council of the Minority Affairs Section as unique and essential. Like many minority physicians, I had been apprehensive about leadership in the AMA given the past history of exclusion and discrimination against physicians of color. However, over the past year as NMA National President, I have had the great fortune of learning more about the AMA through involvement with the URM Coalition, the Center for Health Equity, the 'Release the Pressure' campaign, in supporting NMA co-sponsoring resolutions in the 2022 AMA HOD and personally through webinars with Dr. Harmon. These experiences, along with counsel of trusted NMA leaders also in AMA leadership, have been invaluable in a better understanding not only AMA, but of the necessity for better collaboration between organizations.
