- The survey results guide how the AMA allocates its state advocacy resources in the coming year and fosters alignment of priorities between the AMA and the state and national medical specialty societies.



# Overview of Study Design

- **Methodology:** An online survey was distributed to representatives of state and national medical specialty associations from November 8, 2021 - November 30, 2021 using the Qualtrics survey platform.
- **Sample size:** The 72 respondents are broken out by organization as follows:


# Which of the following legislative or regulatory issues does your association expect to work on in 2022?








# Do you anticipate legislation to change the title physician assistant to physician associate?




## Do you anticipate legislation to adopt the APRN Compact?




# Which of the following private health insurance issues does your association expect to work on in 2022?




# Which of the following digital health issues does your association expect to work on in 2022?




# Which of the following telehealth issues does your association expect to work on in 2022?






# Which of the following health equity issues does your association expect to work on in 2022?
















# Which of the following physician workforce issues does your association expect to work on in 2022?




# Which of the following opioid and drug overdose epidemic issues does your association expect to work on in 2022?




# Which of the following pharmaceutical issues does your association expect to work on in 2022?




# Which of the following medical licensure issues does your association expect to work on in 2022?




# Which of the following antitrust or competition issues does your association expect to work on in 2022?






