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## RECOMMENDED FOR ADOPTION

(1) REPORT B: STATE MEDICAL SOCIETY REPRESENTATION IN THE AMA-YPS ASSEMBLY

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Recommendations in Report B be adopted and the remainder of the Report be filed.

The Governing Council recommends that the following statements be adopted and that the remainder of the report be filed.

- 1. The YPS Governing Council will continue to monitor progress toward filling available representative slots and identify additional engagement opportunities as appropriate.
- 2. The YPS Governing Council will continue to reach out to eligible state societies that have not sent a representative or designated less than the allotted number of representatives for the AMA-YPS Assembly.
- 3. The YPS Governing Council will continue to communicate with YPS representatives and members to highlight the work accomplished during the Assembly meetings and facilitate dialogue about increasing representation in the AMA-YPS.

Report B provides the AMA Bylaws pertaining to state medical society allocation and the 2025 YPS state apportionments. The report outlines the ways in which the Governing Council intends to continue outreach to state medical societies to gain representatives in the AMA-YPS Assembly.

There was no online testimony for Report B. Therefore, your Reference Committee recommends that Report B be adopted and the remainder of the report be filed.

REPORT C: SPECIALTY SOCIETY REPRESENTATION IN THE AMA-YPS (2) **ASSEMBLY** 

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Recommendations in Report C be adopted and the remainder of the Report be filed.

The Governing Council recommends that the following statements be adopted and that the remainder of the report be filed.

- 1. The YPS Governing Council will continue to monitor progress toward filling available representative slots and identify additional engagement opportunities as appropriate.
- 2. The YPS Governing Council will continue to connect with specialty societies that are eligible for representation in the AMA-YPS Assembly that have not sent a representative or designated less than the allotted number of representatives.
- 3. The YPS Governing Council will continue to communicate with YPS representatives and members to highlight the work accomplished during Section Assembly meetings and facilitate dialogue about increasing representation in the AMA-YPS.

Report C provides the AMA Bylaws pertaining to specialty society allocation and the 2025 YPS specialty society apportionments. The report outlines the ways in which the Governing Council intends to continue outreach to specialty societies to gain representatives in the AMA-YPS Assembly.

There was no online testimony for Report C. Therefore, your Reference Committee recommends that Report C be adopted and the remainder of the report be filed.

1. That the changes put forth by the Ad Hoc Committee on Internal Operating Procedures in Report F be adopted.

There was no online testimony for this report. Your Reference Committee thoroughly discussed the new IOP language proposed by the Endorsement Selection Committee. In Section X, subsection A, your Reference Committee recommends the addition of Speaker and Vice Speaker. The Board of Trustees includes these positions, however that may not be known by all YPS members. Your Reference Committee believes that explicitly stating those positions would be helpful for clarification purposes. It also should be noted that your Reference Committee also made an editorial change in Recommendation B, switching the order of Section X, subsection C, items 3 and 4 from how it was originally written in the report. This editorial change accompanies the previously mentioned clarification that the Speaker and Vice Speaker positions are included in the Board of Trustees and those positions should be specified in the IOP.

Therefore, your Reference Committee recommends that Report F be adopted as amended.

(4) RESOLUTION 1: ADDRESSING PROFESSIONALISM STANDARDS IN MEDICAL TRAINING

#### **RECOMMENDATION A:**

The first Resolve in Resolution 1 be amended by substitution.

RESOLVED, that our American Medical Association supports regular institutional review, including review by DEI offices or other appropriate entities, of professionalism policies in medical school and residency programs, ensuring that they do not lead to discriminatory practices; and be it further

RESOLVED, that our American Medical Association supports regular institutional review of professionalism policies in medical school and residency programs-including review mechanisms that account for cultural, religious, gender, and/or other identity-based impacts-by appropriate offices or entities, to ensure such policies do not result in discriminatory practices; and be it further

#### **RECOMMENDATION B:**

## Resolution 1 be <u>adopted as amended.</u>

RESOLVED, that our American Medical Association supports regular institutional review, including review by DEI offices or other appropriate entities, of professionalism policies in medical school and residency programs, ensuring that they do not lead to discriminatory practices; and be it further

RESOLVED, that our AMA supports the ACGME, the AAMC, and AACOM to establish guidelines for residency programs and medical school professionalism policies that encourage institutions to outline actions that constitute a violation; and be it further

RESOLVED, that our AMA advocates for AAMC, ACGME, and AACOM to support measures that prevent medical schools and residency programs from using professionalism violations as a means to stop trainee advocacy measures.

Online forum commentary spoke to the concerns of using specific language, given the pushback against DEI positions currently. The author's amendment provided in the online forum took this feedback into account. Your Reference Committee concurs with the online forum commentary and believes that the proposed amendment aligns with the intent of the resolution. In addition, your Reference Committee minorly added "and/or" to the author's proposed amendment for clarification purposes.

Therefore, your Reference Committee recommends that Resolution 1 be adopted as amended.

(5) RESOLUTION 2: PRESERVATION OF MEDICAID

#### **RECOMMENDATION A:**

Resolution 2 be <u>amended by addition</u> of a new third resolve as follows:

RESOLVED, that the AMA-YPS immediately forward this resolution for consideration by the AMA House of Delegates at the Annual 2025 Meeting.

## **RECOMMENDATION B:**

#### Resolution 2 be adopted as amended.

RESOLVED, that our American Medical Association will make preservation of federal funding and eligibility for all public health insurance programs, including Medicaid and CHIP, an urgent and top legislative advocacy priority, effective immediately at the conclusion of the Annual 2025 House of Delegates Meeting; and be it further

RESOLVED, that our AMA strongly opposes federal and state efforts to restrict eligibility and funding for public health insurance programs, including Medicaid and CHIP.

Online forum commentary was in strong support of this resolution, with a suggestion to consider it as an immediate forward at the Annual 2025 Meeting.

Your Reference Committee discussed this feedback and agreed that this is an important topic to discuss at Annual 2025 and cannot wait until the Interim Meeting. The Committee decided that adding Resolve 3 to immediately forward this resolution would achieve the authors' intent for this resolution. Your Reference Committee also recognizes the other resolutions of this nature that are being considered in the HOD at Annual and hopes the YPS resolution can be utilized by our YPS Delegate and Alternate Delegate to feel empowered to speak on this topic in the HOD.

Therefore, your Reference Committee recommends that Resolution 2 be adopted as amended.

1 (6) RESOLUTION 3: PRESERVING AUTONOMY IN THE PATIENT-PHYSICIAN RELATIONSHIP
3 RECOMMENDATION A:
5 Resolution 3 be amended by addition and deletion:
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RESOLVED, that our American Medical Association <u>study</u> reevaluate sections of the *Code of Medical Ethics* to address outside political, administrative, and financial influences on the patient physician relationship and its impact on shared decision making in the clinical setting.

**RECOMMENDATION B:** 

Resolution 3 be <u>adopted as amended</u>.

RESOLVED, that our American Medical Association reevaluate relevant sections of the *Code of Medical Ethics* to address outside political, administrative, and financial influences on the patient physician relationship and its impact on shared decision making in the clinical setting.

Online Forum commentary was in support of the resolution, with additional clarifying comments from the authors.

Your Reference Committee believes that the word "study" provides clearer direction to the Board of Trustees than "reevaluate". We believe that this amendment still embodies the authors' intent of the resolution to update the *Code of Medical Ethics*.

Therefore, your Reference Committee recommends that Resolution 3 be adopted as amended.

This report is 41 informational and does not include recommendations. 42 43 There was no online testimony for Report E. Therefore, your Reference Committee 44 recommends that Report E be filed.
