#### Statement of Interest

I desire to serve as the next RFS Speaker because I am passionate about shaping the future of medicine through organized medicine and systems-based work. My curriculum vitae outlines much of the work in health policy and medical education alongside specific examples I will emphasize here. In my first year of medical school, I started a street medicine program that served the homeless community in Buffalo, NY called UB HEALS. Under my leadership the program raised over \$60,000 and is still active today as a student led faculty supported program. Within the American Medical Association, I served as a delegate in the House of Medicine and became familiar with policy implementation and parliamentary procedure. I further led the Committee of Long Range Planning in the AMA Medical Student Section as chair with students across the country. Through our collective efforts, we publish reports regarding medical student and physician burnout and the rising cost of medical education tuition. We also hosted programming efforts involving the AMA's Steps Forward Campaign aimed towards addressing burnout. In residency I was appointed as the chair-elect of the national Ultrasound Committee within the Emergency Medicine Resident Association.

As Speaker of the RFS I will facilitate the work of the section to ensure we have productive and entertaining sessions reviewing all of the submitted resolutions to our biannual meetings. I will aim to facilitate parliamentary procedure in a way that suits novices and long-term members.

#### Diversity Statement

As a first generation American with two parents from Beirut, Lebanon, I believe I bring cultural diversity to the position of speaker on the RFS Governing Council. My Dad moved from Lebanon to begin his psychiatry residency in New York State in the early 90s where I was born.
