Subject: 2025 Constituent Society Delegate Apportionment

I am pleased to provide delegate apportionment figures for 2025. Under American Medical Association (AMA) Bylaws (§2.1 and subsections), states and territories (referred to as constituent societies) in the House of Delegates will be apportioned a total of 322 delegates, which is an increase of 10 delegates over 2024.

Delegate apportionment is based on official AMA membership records as of December 31, 2024, with one delegate apportioned for every 1,000 AMA members, or fraction thereof. The attached table provides a state-by-state breakdown.

Those states that have endorsed regional medical student delegates or resident sectional delegates should be aware that these delegates are not reflected in the figures that appear in the constituent society apportionment table. The total number of regional medical students and resident sectional delegates are included in this memo. Societies endorsing these individuals should already be aware of who they have endorsed. Regional medical student delegates and resident sectional delegates will be seated with their endorsing societies. Student and resident alternate delegates serving temporarily as a delegate will be seated in the space designated for the student or resident delegate endorsed by your society even though they are likely to have been endorsed by another society; please be sure your delegation is aware of this situation. States are encouraged to include the students and resident delegates they have endorsed in delegation activities and communications.

The credentialing process for June's House of Delegates meeting will begin shortly. Under AMA bylaws, delegates and alternate delegates must be certified before *each* meeting. You will receive a separate communication regarding credentials.

Please ensure that your delegates and alternate delegates have renewed their AMA memberships for 2025. AMA bylaws specify that all delegates (§2.0.1.1) and alternate delegates (§2.8.1) must be AMA members, and individuals who are not members will not be included on a delegation roster. You will be notified of any discrepancies.

MEDICAL STUDENT SECTION REGIONAL DELEGATES AND ALTERNATE DELEGATES

For 2025, regional student delegates were apportioned <u>25 delegates (and like number alternates)</u> using year-end 2023 AMA medical student membership figures within a region, with a delegate being apportioned for every 2,000 student members in the region and additional delegates apportioned per Bylaw 2.3.2.

Pursuant to American Medical Association Bylaws (§2.3 and subsections), medical student regional delegates and alternate delegates were elected utilizing a regional structure. The seven medical student regions are:

- Region 1: Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington, Wyoming.
- Region 2: Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, Wisconsin
- Region 3: Arkansas, Kansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Oklahoma, Texas.
- Region 4: Alabama, Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, Puerto Rico, South Carolina, Tennessee.
- Region 5: Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, Ohio, West Virginia.
- Region 6: Delaware, District of Columbia, Maryland, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Virginia.
- Region 7: Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New York, Rhode Island, Vermont.

Per AMA Bylaw 2.10.8, Medical Student Section regional delegates "shall be seated with the students' endorsing constituent association. Alternate or substitute delegates are assigned to the original regional delegate's seat location during the time they are seated for the original delegate."

RESIDENT AND FELLOW SECTION DELEGATES AND ALTERNATE DELEGATES

For 2025, Resident and Fellows were apportioned <u>41 sectional delegates</u> (and like number of alternate <u>delegates</u>) using year-end 2023 AMA resident and fellow membership figures, with a delegate being apportioned for every 2,000 members (AMA Bylaws, §2.4 and subsections).

Resident and fellow sectional delegates are to be seated with their endorsing society (AMA Bylaw, §2.10.9). Alternate delegates who are substituting for a delegate will sit with the society that endorsed the delegate for whom the alternate is substituting.

Subject: 2025 Specialty Society Delegate Apportionment

I am pleased to provide delegate apportionment figures for 2025. The apportionment is based on official American Medical Association (AMA) membership records and Policy G-600.027, "Designation of Specialty Societies for Representation in the House of Delegates." Constituent societies have been apportioned 321 delegates for 2025 (not including one delegate slot for the vice speaker per AMA Bylaw, §2.5). Consequently, 321 delegates were apportioned across the national medical specialty societies in the House of Delegates. Adjustments have been made for several societies to maintain the parity called for in

Every society seated in the House of Delegates is entitled to one delegate, but the following 54 national specialty societies have more than one delegate (with a like number of alternate delegates):

Remaining national medical specialty societies are each apportioned one delegate (and one alternate) for 2025. The net result is that there will be 321 specialty society delegates this year. Delegate apportionment figures for all specialty societies appear in the 2025 Specialty Society Delegate Apportionment table accompanying this memo. Included are the two societies expected to be seated in the House of Delegates in June.

Several specialty societies have endorsed resident and fellow sectional representatives (§2.4 of the bylaws). The delegate numbers above and in the Specialty Society Delegate Apportionment table do not include these resident sectional delegates. Total number of resident sectional delegates is included in this memo. Societies endorsing these individuals should already be aware of who they have endorsed. Arrangements will be made to seat them with their endorsing societies. You should note, however, that resident sectional alternate delegates serving temporarily will be seated in the space designated for the resident endorsed by your society even though the alternate delegate is likely to have been endorsed by another society; please be sure your delegation is aware of this situation. Societies are encouraged to include the residents they have endorsed in delegation activities and communications.

Traditionally, delegates for national medical specialty societies with a single delegate have been seated in the House of Delegates with the delegate's home state. Over the last few years, several specialty societies have indicated that they would like to be seated together, and these groupings will continue. Other specialty society delegations that would like to be seated together in the House of Delegates should notify Jeanne Uehling in writing no later than March 14, 2025.

The credentialing process for the June meeting will begin shortly. Under AMA bylaws, delegates and alternate delegates must be certified before *each* meeting. Please ensure that your delegates and alternate delegates have renewed their AMA memberships for 2025.
