40	(USPSTF) recommendation, appropriate age to initiate discussion on family building as
41	well as pre-conception counseling, and presumed patient interest on this topic.

14	public health benefits of family building and pre-conception counseling. It was also stated

that the frequency of discussions on family building and pre-conception counseling does

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not appear to be well documented.

## AMA-YPS Reference Committee Report (I-22) - Page 5

Your Reference Committee wishes to note that the development of a USPSTF recommendation is a stringent, evidence-based process that focuses on topics within a particular scope. According to the <u>USPSTF Procedure Manual</u>, topics must relate to a service that is meant to support primary or secondary prevention and address a disease with a substantial health burden. Further, if a topic is accepted, the development of a USPSTF recommendation could take two to three years to complete. Hence, your Reference Committee proffered an amendment to address the concerns noted in the online forum and allow the AMA more flexibility to address this important issue. Your Reference Committee recommends that Resolution 1 be adopted as amended.
