Kamaal Jones, MD, is a class of 2021 graduate from the Stanford pediatrics residency program. After his undergraduate studies at Cornell University, Kamaal completed over 1,700 hours of health equity service work with Community HealthCorps. In 2014 Dr. Jones began medical school at Loyola University Chicago, where he served as the chair of the Health Disparities Committee through Loyola's Center for Community and Global Health, and for two years worked closely with Chicago-based organizations Project Brotherhood and Healing Hurt People Chicago to help facilitate a weekly support group for teenage boys who survived gunshot violence in Chicago.

During his residency training Dr. Jones served as co-chair of the Stanford Pediatrics Advocacy Council, in addition to being a graduate of the Leadership Education in Advancing Diversity Program, and a scholar in the Stanford Community Engagement and Advocacy Research Track, where he worked with Community Works program "Project WHAT!" to study the impact of a support group for children of incarcerated parents. Dr. Jones also served as a leader within the national Scrubs Addressing the Firearm Epidemic organization. Dr. Jones will be continuing his focus on health equity work as he transitions to serving as a pediatrician for children in the foster-care and child welfare system in LA County's High Desert Regional Health Center Hub clinic.
