While continuing this service as the RFS representative, I remained actively engaged in RFS matters, chairing RFS reference committees, advocating for insurance access and public health training in the RFS Committee on Public Health, and serving on the AMA HOD Reference Committee D Science and Public Health. Currently, I represent our YPS as the vice-chair of the AMA BOT Advisory Committee on LGBTQ Issues and have served as the Senior Digital Fellow for the Ambassador Steering Committee.

As a dedicated AMA member, I have earned recognition for serving each section dutifully have authored or co-authored half dozen resolutions that have gone on to be adopted by our HOD. In building coalitions to draft, revise, and pass our resolutions, I have earned the respect of key stakeholder sections that our YPS actively seek to involve in our business. As noted briefly, I have served in numerous roles to advocate for patients, students, trainees, and physicians and have consequently earned the recognition of the AMA Foundation, the University of Chicago Alumni Association, Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine Alumni Association, and the White House Office of Public Engagement.

Beyond my current service, I have made a point to collaborate across various sections and groups to address intersectional issues, particularly as they relate to sexual & gender identity and racial & ethnic identities. Essentially, I've continued to build my skills as a listener, connector, and collaborator to address issues of diversity, equity, inclusion and explicitly tackle racism, homophobia, transphobia and any bias that limits the well-being and success of anyone.
